School Uniform - No Excuses!

All parents and carers know our school uniform policy and requirements, but too many children have been coming to school recently not wearing the full, correct uniform. It was unbelievable how much time was wasted contacting parents on Monday because, despite all the reminders about the school photos that day, many children came to school wearing casual home clothes.

We want our children to be proud of our school and wearing school uniform is part of that. School uniform ensures that every child feels part of the school community. Every school has a uniform and Moorland is no different, so please help us by ensuring your child wears uniform every day.



We keep the required school uniform to a minimum so you can buy tailored plain black or dark grey trousers/skirt or pinafore from any supplier. When your child moves up to secondary school they will be expected to wear <u>tailored</u> **not** jogging bottoms too.



All children from Reception to Year 5 must wear a burgundy sweatshirt even on PE days. Year 6 pupils are the only class to wear the black school jumpers – not sports hoodies please.

Your child must wear **sensible black shoes for school** as the children use the outdoor areas every day. No brightly coloured trainers or sandals, thank you.

Our school uniform is non-negotiable and no different to the expectations of every other school. If your child has outgrown their sweatshirt, then **why not visit the**Community Shop in Beanhill to see if they have any 2nd hand uniform available.







We also have lots of **unnamed** and unclaimed lost uniform that we will put out under the covered area for you to check next week. Please make it easier for us by naming all items of clothes and remind your child that they are responsible for looking after their uniforms and not the staff, they all have their own peg or locker and many of the younger years have a jumper box too.

If you find that your child has outgrown their uniform and it's in good condition and clean, then why not find out if the community shop could use it. Why add it to the landfill when someone else could use it.
