OFSTED Inspection Report



All parents and carers should have received a copy of the report of the OFSTED inspection in December which is also on our website.

We are delighted to confirm that the school has been graded GOOD in 3 of the 5 areas. These are Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development and Early Years.

As a School and a community, we have made enormous progress since the last OFSTED report. We really appreciated that parents and children spoke positively about our School, but we are on a journey of **Continuing Improvement**. One of the most significance barriers that we face in ensuring all our children achieve their full potential is persistent absence and ongoing lateness. Despite all our best efforts, our absence is far higher than national and our pupils' outcomes much lower.

It cannot come as a surprise to parents and carers how more confident their children become when they experience success. Success in their learning is different for each child, but attending school every day is key to them finding that success.

This is where we need to work together to move our school further forward so that we achieve the very best for all pupils. Our attendance and family support team will be working with families where there are concerns about absence and lateness. We are confident that with your commitment, we shall see improvements in this area. Well done if your child is already attending School every day and on time. Your child is already on their journey to success!






Attendance and Time-Keeping
